



## World History Extra Credit Mask Project Directions

This project will be done entirely at home and is worth up to 20 points of extra credit. Don't procrastinate as all three areas below must be done by the due date.

**Research:** You will research information about the mask you choose, the people who made the mask, and the country in which the mask was made (if more than one country or group of people made the mask, pick one to research). Please start with the numerous sites on Mr. Weinberg's Webpage (see Mask Project Link). You will need to answer all questions on the handout regarding your mask. Read the questions, find the answers and **USE YOUR OWN WORDS**.

**Mask:** Your mask should be an **original reproduction of the Mask** that you research. The materials you make your mask from is up to you but will have these guidelines:

1. Your mask should resemble the mask you are researching.
2. Your mask must be totally finished, and dry, by the due date.
3. You may NOT purchase a premade mask and just color it. You must create, decorate, put effort into & take pride in making your mask to obtain maximum amount of points.



**Presentation:** Using notecards, you will make a 2 minute Reflection Presentation using your mask as your visual aid. A reflection presentation is reflecting on the project, not giving facts about your mask, people, and country. Use the questions below to guide your presentation.

- a. What made you choose this mask to research and create?
- b. What did you see, think and wonder when you saw this mask?
- c. What did you learn while doing this project?
- d. What did you make your mask out of and why did you decide on these materials?
- e. What materials was the mask originally made from?
- f. Give the most interesting fact about the people and the country behind your mask? What stood out to you?
- g. What are you proud of regarding this project?
- h. What did you like and/or dislike about this project? Explain why.
- i. Tell about your successes & failures.
- j. If you had to do it all over again, what would you do differently? Why?
