## Mrs. Leitner's Redo and Late Work Policies

Late Work: In order to turn in an assignment past the due date, students must request an **Incomplete Assignment FORM**. This must be completed, signed by a parent, and turned in to Mrs. Leitner with the assignment attached **No LATER** than one week after the assignment was due or one week prior to the last day of a marking period (whichever comes first). This allows Mrs. Leitner to assess and input grades in a timely manner. Mrs. Leitner reserves the right to deny students the opportunity to turn assignments in late, as noted in the "Teacher Discretion" portion of this document.
